



LILYDALE JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB

UNIFORM POLICY

PURPOSE:

To ensure a consistent, professional, and club-proud appearance across all Lilydale Junior Football Club (LJFC) teams, volunteers, and support staff.

Coaches and Team Staff Expectations:

Minimum Standard:

- All Head Coaches, Assistant Coaches, and Team Managers wear a LJFC blue polo on all game days & social events.
- All Head Coaches, Assistant Coaches wear a LJFC blue polo or Club Jacket to training days.
- When weather requires, all Head Coaches, Assistant Coaches & Team Managers are expected to wear the sponsor-funded LJFC jackets.

Club Issued Apparel:

Upon Appointment, A Head Coach, Assistant Coach, and Team Manager for each side will be provided with:

- One (1) LJFC blue polo shirt
- One (1) sponsor-funded LJFC jacket

Additional Team Staff:

- If team structures include more than three staff (coach/assistant/team manager), any additional LJFC jackets or LJFC Blue polo must be purchased by the team to meet uniform expectations.

Trainers / Medics:

- Must wear training bibs provided by the club – ideally worn over a blue Falcons polo.

Runners:

- Must wear the official runner's top provided by the club – ideally paired with black shorts.



Players Expectations:

Match Day

Players should arrive in either:

- LJFC hoodie, LJFC blue polo or LJFC training top

All players must wear full LJFC uniform during games.

Each Player will be provided an LJFC Playing Jumper that is to be returned at the conclusion of the year

Failure to return at LJFC jumper or the returning of a damaged Jumper will result in a fee to purchase a replacement jumper

Training

Players should attend training in LJFC training tops.

Clash Jumpers

Clash Jumpers are to be used against designated clash teams (EFNL allocated clash) away games.

However, if it is recognised that changing to our clash jumper (before or during a game) would aid the players & spectators, teams will be able to utilise the clash jumper. A common sense approach needs to be taken and the clash jumper is only for a clash - not because we like it better. The Secretary needs to be informed if clash jumper is used.

Summary:

This policy ensures all representatives of Lilydale Junior Football Club reflect the club's values, professionalism, and identity. Wearing club-issued attire helps create unity, pride, and recognition both within and outside the club.
